We have invited area clergy and faithful to attend and so will need some help in putting out fast-worthy food for after the Liturgy. Fish, wine, and oil are permitted for our parish on this day to help us keep the feast!

The Dormition of the Theotokos, one of the Twelve Great Feasts, will be celebrated this Friday evening with Vigil at 7:00 p.m. and Divine Liturgy Saturday morning at 9:00. We do well to keep the Feast by attending as much of the cycle of services as we can. The Dormition Fast ends after Liturgy Saturday morning. This week is an excellent time for any who have not made a recent Confession or Communion to do so.

From Saint Maximus

Resurrectional Troparion, tone 8

Thou didst descend from on high, O tenderhearted One. / Thou didst accept the three-day burial to free us from our passions. / O Lord, our life and resurrection, glory to Thee.

Transfiguration, Troparion, tone 7

Thou wast transfigured upon the mountain, O Christ God, / showing Thy glory to Thy disciples as far as they could bear it. / Through the prayers of the Theotokos, / make Thine everlasting light shine also upon us sinners. / O Giver of Light, glory to Thee!

St Herman, Torparion

O righteous Father Herman of Alaska / North Star of Christ's holy Church, / the light of thy holy life and great deeds / guideth those that follow the Orthodox way. / Together we lift high the holy Cross, / which thou didst plant firmly in America. / Let all behold and glorify Jesus Christ, / singing his holy Resurrection.

Resurrectional Kontakion, tone 8

Having risen from the tomb Thou didst waken the dead and raise Adam, / and Eve exulteth in Thy Resurrection, / and the ends of the world keep festival for Thy rising from the dead, O Most Merciful One.
