### From Saint Maximus

Knowledge is good by nature, and so likewise is health, but their opposites have benefited even more than have they. The image of the earthly man consists in the capital vices, such as folly, cowardice, intemperance, injustice. The image of the heavenly man consists in the cardinal virtues, a prudence, courage, temperance, justice.
