From Saint Maximus

Some of the things which we do for the sake of God are done in obedience to the commandments; others are done not in obedience to the commandments, so to speak, but as a voluntary offering. For example, we are required by the commandments to love God and our neighbor, to love our enemies, not to commit adultery or murder and so on. And when we transgress these commandments, we are condemned. But we are not commanded to live as virgins, to abstain from marriage, to renounce possessions, to withdraw into solitude, and so forth. These are of the nature of gifts, so that if through weakness we are unable to fulfill some of the commandments, we may by these free gifts propitiate our blessed Master.

He who honors celibacy and virginity must keep his loins girded and his lamp burning. He keeps his loins girded through self-control, and is lamp burning through prayer, contemplation, and spiritual love.

Resurrectional Troparion, tone 2

When Thou, didst descend to death, O Life Immortal / Thou didst slay Hell with the lightning-flash of Thy Divinity, / and, when from the nether regions Thou didst raise the dead, / all the powers of Heaven cried out: / ‘O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory to Thee!’

St. Maximus, Troparion, tone 3

By an outpouring of the Holy Spirit / thou didst pour forth Christ’s sacred teachings, / thou didst expound with Divine authority / the self-emptying of God the Word / and wast radiant in thy confession of the True Faith: / O, Glorious Father Maximus / pray to Christ our God / to grant us His great mercy.

St. James, Brother of the Lord, Troparion, tone 2

As a disciple of the Lord thou didst receive the Gospel, O just one; / as a martyr thou dost possess what is infinite; / as the brother of God, thou hast boldness before Him; / and as a hierarch, thou canst make entreaty.
